



## FORUS 2024: A YEAR OF COLLECTIVE POWER & ACTION

**In a time when civil society faces unprecedented challenges, Forus has remained solid in its mission to connect, support, and amplify the voices of its members.**

2024 has been an important year for our network—a year of expansion, collaboration, and meaningful impact. Together, we’ve turned up the volume on civil society’s calls for action, driving change at national, regional, and global levels.

As **Forus member in Nepal**, NFN, expressed, “Forus is an umbrella of CSOs so needed during sunny and rainy seasons for organisations.” This sentiment captures the essence of Forus’ role—providing support and safe spaces of connection through both challenges and successes.

With 72 national CSO platforms and 7 regional CSO coalitions, Forus mobilised its network across 124 countries, advocating for an enabling environment for civil society, financing for sustainable development, digital rights, and human rights protection.

We hosted 54 events, engaged over 1,700 participants, and facilitated more than 200 collaborations with allies worldwide, further strengthening our collective influence.

As Global Focus, **Forus member in Denmark**, shared: “There is an enormous potential in the membership base of Forus. Counting all the partners engaged in the national platforms that are members of Forus sums up to a huge number of civil society actors. Civil society actors that are stronger together in fighting for a more just world.” These words reflect the power of collective action and the potential of our united network.

At the Forus General Assembly in Botswana, members from over 65 countries came together to co-create solutions for the most pressing challenges facing civil society today. The insights and ideas shared during this gathering will shape Forus’ strategic direction for the next five years (2026–2030), ensuring that we continue to lead and inspire within global civil society.

However, 2024 also presented its share of challenges. Civil society continues to grapple with increasing restrictions on its ability to operate, with restrictive legislations, and shifting funding landscapes. In response, Forus has expanded its advocacy efforts, making contributions to major policy discussions at forums such as the UN Summit of the Future, the High-Level Political Forum, the Finance in Common process, and the Internet Governance Forum (IGF), among others.

**Forus member in Gambia**, Tango, shared a key insight: “Empowerment, networking and partnership is the value of the Forus network.” This emphasis on collaboration has been at the heart of Forus' work, strengthening connections and boosting the capacity of CSOs globally.

We also launched two ambitious initiatives—CADE and EU SEE—aimed at shaping the digital future and fostering an enabling environment for CSOs worldwide. Our campaigns, including #MarchWithUs, #ShiftingThePower, and #Let’sTalkDigital, reached thousands, elevating grassroots voices. Additionally, the 12 members started in a new cycle of our Leadership Development Programme, while 6 member platforms received support for their advocacy on SDGs and the Voluntary National Reviews.

As Cooperation Canada, **Forus member in Canada**, pointed out: “The Forus Network empowers regional and national CSO platforms worldwide to leverage collaboration and solidarity, fostering collective mobilisation, advocacy, and capacity strengthening to enhance effectiveness and agency.”

Looking ahead, 2025 will be a year of shaping Forus’ next strategic vision. This will be a collective effort, with members, partners, and allies contributing their expertise and insights to co-create the roadmap for the future.

Through a series of consultations—regional, governance, and partner-focused—we will collaboratively design the strategy that will guide Forus through 2026-2030.

As we reflect on the milestones of 2024, one message stands clear: Forus remains a network built on solidarity, innovation, and the unwavering belief that civil society is central to building a just and sustainable world.



# OUR STORY AND MISSION:

As Forus continues to push for shifts in power, for social justice, and inclusivity, and embarks on the development of our new strategy for 2026-2030, the network remains committed to convening thought-leadership spaces, producing collaborative research and reports, and amplifying civil society's messages on the global stage. Looking ahead, Forus reaffirms its dedication to transformative change, optimism, and collective action—working towards a more just, inclusive, and sustainable world.


## Forus General Assembly: The Power of the Network

At the 2024 Forus General Assembly in Gaborone, Botswana, members from over 65 countries came together to address the pressing challenges facing civil society in an increasingly polarised and crisis-driven world. The gathering, the first in-person of this kind since 2018, provided a crucial space to discuss strategic foresight, policy demands, and capacity strengthening, ensuring that civil society organisations, activists, journalists, and human rights defenders are prepared to tackle emerging and ongoing issues. In partnership with the national civil society platform BOCONGO and the regional coalition Southern African Council of Non-Governmental Organisations (SAF-CNGO), the General Assembly was made possible with the support of the European Union and the Agence Française de Développement (AFD).

## Welcoming New Forus Members!

Forus is proud to have welcomed three new national platform members:

- **Estonian Roundtable for Development Cooperation (AKÜ)** – Representing 36 Estonian NGOs focused on sustainable development and global citizenship education.
- **Bulgarian Platform for International Development (BPID)** – Uniting 16 Bulgarian NGOs advocating for human rights, civil liberties, and democracy.
- **Norwegian Forum for Development and Environment (ForUM)** – A coalition of 60 organisations working on development, environment, peace, and human rights.



## The Summit of the Future 2024: A Moment of Hope and a Call to Action.

In September 2024, many Forus members from across five continents gathered in New York to engage in and influence the UN Summit of the Future, a major milestone in the network's collective efforts to promote inclusive, just, and sustainable societies. The adoption of the Pact for the Future was a signal to the world that—despite rising polarisation, conflict, and distrust—governments can still come together around ambitious global agendas.

While the Pact includes welcome commitments—such as reaffirming multilateralism, recognising the need to reform the global financial architecture, and laying the groundwork for more inclusive digital governance—it also revealed critical gaps. Civic space protections remain weak, implementation mechanisms unclear, and ambition on climate action insufficient. The omission of LGBTIQ+ rights and lack of progress on digital peace and security were also missed opportunities. And yet, the Pact is a starting point. It reaffirms that multilateral cooperation is still possible—and still needed. Forus remains convinced that a better world is possible. But the path forward requires bold implementation, robust accountability, and unwavering support for civil society.

As Forus looks to 2025 and beyond—with key moments like the FfD4 Summit and COP30 on the horizon—Forus will continue to advocate for urgent action, locally and globally. Forus will keep pushing to #UNMute civil society, promote equity in global governance, and support our members as they translate global promises into national progress.

### Forus Campaigns: Amplifying Voices Driving Change


Building on previous storytelling initiatives, the Forus network continues to "share the mic" with civil society organisations and activists worldwide, in partnership with Forus members. In 2024, key campaigns include:

- **#UNMute civil society:** In a joint statement addressed to key UN authorities, a coalition of over 440 CSOs and networks from all over the world, co-led by Forus and several of its members, expressed concerns about the current UN engagement mechanisms for civil society, particularly ahead of the [UN Summit of the Future](#). - **#MarchWithUs** – An annual series highlighting gender justice and the fight for women's rights.
- **#Let'sTalkDigital** – Raising awareness on digital rights and the importance of inclusive internet governance.
- **#ShiftingThePower** – Advocating for local leadership and structural change in the development sector.

### Forus Leadership Development Program: Strengthening Future Leaders

After 3 years since the last Forus Leadership Development Programme, a new cycle was launched in August 2024, bringing together participants from five continents to explore adaptive and inclusive leadership. This initiative supports emerging civil society leaders with tools to build resilient networks, drive social change, and advocate for civil society's role in global governance. This cycle places a special focus on women's leadership, aligning with Forus' commitment to gender equity, our annual campaign #MarchWithUs and the upcoming 2025 review of SDG 5 (Gender Equality).

## Defending an Enabling Environment for civil society: Responding to Legislative Threats

Civil society organisations worldwide are facing increasing legislative restrictions that threaten their independence. Forus members actively push back against these pressures, working to defend civic space and organisational freedoms.

One of the most significant developments was the progress of the new EU SEE (Enabling Environment for Civil Society in the EU) initiative. The EU System for an Enabling Environment is designed to document changes and shed light on critical trends in the enabling environment for civil society across 86 countries in Africa, the Middle East, Asia and the Pacific, the Americas and the Caribbean. Rather than focusing solely on past challenges, 2024 marked a turning point—helping to shape and lay the groundwork for EU SEE's implementation.

Now, we are beginning to see the results. The release of the first EU SEE baseline reports and alerts provides a powerful new tool for monitoring and understanding the civil society environment across regions. For the first time, we have access to structured, comparative data that offers the evidence long needed to advocate for essential conditions—or "must-have parameters"—that allow civil society organisations to operate freely, openly, and sustainably.

### Forus and Internet Governance: Shaping a Digital Future for All

Civil society still faces barriers in digital governance spaces, from limited policy access to underrepresentation—especially from the Global South. **Our new podcast series, *Digital Futures***, with over 100,000 views explored civic space, digital governance, and AI’s impact on human rights. At the **2024 Internet Governance Forum (IGF)**, Forus presented research on CSO capacity to influence tech policies, share strategies for greater impact, and advocate for digital rights.



### Civil Society Engaging with Public Development Banks

Ahead of the 2025 Finance in Common Summit in South Africa, Forus launched a new Engaging Public Development Banks (PDBs) study and toolkit. These resources help Forus members and civil society partners navigate engagement with PDBs at local, national, and global levels, pushing for financing decisions to be aligned with human rights, sustainability, and community needs. ## Rebuilding Trust for Inclusive Governance - Unlocking SDG 16 for Peaceful Societies

In 2015, the international community embarked on an ambitious journey with the adoption of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, setting forth 17 SDGs to create a world that is just, peaceful, and prosperous. Central to this transformative agenda is SDG 16, which aims to promote peaceful and inclusive societies, ensure access to justice for all, and build effective, accountable, and inclusive institutions at all levels. In this report Forus members analyse the status of implementation of SDG 16 and share experiences for the way forward.

## Engaging Public Development Banks - Civil society Toolkit and Study

Public Development Banks (PDBs) play a crucial role in financing sustainable development, yet civil society organisations often face significant barriers when engaging with these institutions. Understanding how to navigate these financial actors is key to ensuring that development projects are aligned with human rights, environmental sustainability, and social justice. This Forus study and the toolkit for CSOs that it inspired examine the experiences of civil society in engaging with three major PDBs—the African Development Bank, the Asian Development Bank, and the Inter-American Development Bank. Through case studies and real-world examples, these resources analyse the challenges and opportunities for civil society advocacy within these financial institutions, providing insights into effective engagement strategies, highlighting lessons learned from past interactions, and offering recommendations.



**#MarchWithUs:** For its fourth edition, the campaign continued advocacy for gender justice, equity and rights with over 20 activists and Forus members. Join the movement in 2025! It highlighted voices like Matcha Phorn-In, an Indigenous LGBTQIA+ activist from Thailand, Marijeta Mojašević, a disability rights advocate from the Balkans, The Instituto Marielle Franco fighting against political violence, Ilex Acción Jurídica on the decriminalisation of abortion in Colombia, Kenya's Fahe Kerubo, who fights for gender equality and sexual health rights. Several Forus members also joined to spotlight critical global and local issues. Asonog in Honduras shared documentaries highlighting their efforts to combat femicide and featuring the story of the first Indigenous woman leader in a local community. Similarly, FONGTO, NNNGO, INFID, SLOGA, and the Plateforme Nationale des Organisations de la Société Civile de Madagascar showcased their initiatives to advance gender equality and support communities.

**SDG16 Rebuilding Trust for Inclusive Governance:** With the report and social media actions, we provided tools for governance structures based on transparency, participation, and equity.

Through the campaign, discover the intersection between civic space, digital rights and the opportunities to shape digital policies, a feminist internet and a "gender view" of digitalisation as well as specific digital rights issues – from internet shutdowns to cybersecurity, surveillance and digital challenges in crisis-affected zones. ## EVENTS

Forus was also involved in many events and conferences.

Below a snapshot of some events which we co-organised or participated in:

- **UN Civil Society Conference (9-10 May, Nairobi):** Forus, along with members like Abong (Brazil) and NNGO (Nigeria), advocated for the network's key contributions to global governance and sustainable development. Joining key discussions on the Pact for the Future and the Global Digital Compact, as well as co-facilitating sessions on #UNMute Civil Society and #SDG16Now, Forus highlighted the need for greater civil society inclusion in UN processes and the importance of multilateralism, inclusion, and sustainable development.
- **2024 High-Level Political Forum (8-17 July, NYC):** Forus organised two side events. On 8 July, the "Rebuilding Trust for Inclusive Governance" online side event marked the launch of the Inclusive Governance and SDG 16 Forus report, with members sharing strategies to enhance transparency, combat corruption, and strengthen institutions. On 9 July, the joint in-person side event "From Margins to Mainstream", co-organised with TAP Network, UNDP, and the governments of Uganda and Nepal, emphasised inclusive decision-making and collaboration to rebuild trust and address regional challenges.

- **UN Summit of the Future (22-23 Sept, NYC):** Forus played a key role in amplifying civil society's voice through a member-led Taskforce co-chaired by NNNGO (Nigeria) and Abong (Brazil). The Taskforce advocated for an ambitious Pact for the Future, consolidating feedback from Forus members, strengthening CSO participation, and aligning national and global advocacy strategies. Key achievements included facilitating member inputs on the Pact's drafts, revitalising the #UNMute campaign for greater CSO inclusion in UN processes, and organising three side events during the Summit on inclusive governance, Global South leadership and a people-centered approach to ODA. These initiatives strengthened CSO's participation, and advanced priorities for an ambitious Pact for the Future and Global Digital Compact. Post-Summit, Forus developed actionable recommendations for implementing the 56 actions of the Pact for the Future at the national level.
- **ICANN Annual General Meeting (9-14 Nov, Istanbul):** The CADE consortium shared preliminary results of the Mapping and Baseline Study and gather feedback from noncommercial stakeholders within ICANN. During the meeting, the CADE consortium was represented by Kenneth Harry Msiska (Forus) and Karolina Iwanska (ECNL).

- **Civil Society (C20) Summit (13 Nov, Rio de Janeiro):** Held alongside the G20 Summit in Brazil, the C20 marked the conclusion of Brazil's leadership of the G20 civil society engagement group. Chaired by Forus member Abong (Brazil), the C20 gathered global CSOs, including Forus and its members CANGO (China) and JANIC (Japan), to address critical issues such as climate, inequality, and economic justice. While the G20 Rio de Janeiro Declaration included several commitments, civil society called for stronger actions and more inclusive engagement to tackle these urgent challenges.
- **Internet Governance Forum (IGF) (15-19 Dec, Riyadh):** The CADE consortium organised the session Empowering Civil Society: Bridging Gaps in Policy Influence, moderated by Forus and featuring inputs from Diplo and KICTANet. The session highlighted findings from CADE's Mapping of digital governance spaces, a Baseline Study on civil society capacity, and an Africa Case Study exploring advocacy and participation challenges. CADE also met with the EU to present its first-year achievements and discuss future collaboration on inclusive digital governance.

## 6 Forus 2024 Organisational Self-Assessment

The 2024 Organisational Self-assessment helped Forus members reflect on network structures and skills, highlighting strengths and areas for growth. The 24 members that completed the analysis, indicated confidence in strategy building, recruiting diverse governance bodies, and gaining recognition. However, digital skills, funding gaps, and knowledge-sharing remain key priorities. Insights from the assessments will shape tailored support for our network.

## 7 New cycle of National Project Partnerships

Through dedicated 1-1 partnerships with national members, Forus advances the capacity strengthening efforts of members. These projects are defined by the needs of each national platform and its own approach for change. Of the 24 Forus members who participated in the 2024 Organisational Assessment, 12 were selected by the Peer Committee as partners of the 6th cycle of national project partnerships. The Peer Committee is a voluntary member-led group with the mandate to design the calls for applications, analyse and select project partners collectively. In 2024, the Peer Committee was composed by ANONG (Uruguay), CNONGD (DRC), Cooperation Canada, FONG-STP (São Tomé e Príncipe), CODE-NGO (Philippines), FONGTO (Togo), JOINT (Mozambique), and Red Encuentro (Argentina).

**Advancing fundraising skills, digital capacity, and collaborative synergies for local impact**

UNITAS, Bolivia

UNITAS (Unión Nacional de Instituciones de Trabajo de Acción Social - Bolivia) project aims to enhance the fundraising and resource mobilisation skills of 60% of key staff in 22 partner organisations by September 2025. Additionally, it will strengthen the technical capabilities of 40% of these institutions in using digital tools for knowledge management. Finally, at least 30% of partners will collaborate to develop thematic and territorial synergies to influence local agendas through structured dialogues and meetings.

**Strategic planning and digital capacity for effective member engagement**

SINERGIA (Red Venezolana de OSC) to improve strategic planning and digital strengths for remote work and enhanced communication with its members.

The objectives are to strengthen strategic planning for efficient management capacities, foster knowledge exchange and networking, and provide training to improve member effectiveness. Key activities involve conducting a strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats analysis, revising the organisation's mission and vision, setting clear goals with measurable indicators, offering training in strategic planning, and establishing a monitoring and evaluation system to track progress and adapt strategies.

### **Enhancing governance, regional collaboration, and strategic alignment**

PFNOSCM, Madagascar

PFNOSCM (Plateforme Nationale des Organisation de la Société Civile de Madagascar) project aims to improve governance, strengthen sub-regional platforms, and validate a strategic plan for 2025-2028. Key objectives include organising regional assemblies to elect the new governance body of the platform, conducting institutional and organisational diagnostics, and improving communication strategies. Activities involve two inter-regional workshops, member engagement in governance revision, and preparing a national convention which will coincide with PFNOSCM's 20th anniversary, ensuring collective ownership and strategic alignment across sub-regions.

## **Revising vision, strengthening governance, and developing advocacy for a more inclusive future**

PDA, Pakistan

PDA (Pakistan Development Alliance) project aims to address these by revising PDA's vision and mission, developing a five-year strategic plan, redefining its governance structure with a Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Justice framework, and creating a comprehensive advocacy strategy. Activities include providing staff training on a human rights-based approach, developing a more detailed advocacy strategy, and engaging members in revising governance structures to ensure inclusivity and shared ownership.

## **Enhancing member engagement, board diversity, and human resources**

NNNGO, Nigeria

NNNGO (Nigeria Network of NGOs) aims to boost member engagement through events, improve board diversity, and strengthen human resources by the end of the project. Key activities include capacity-building for MEAL and HR staff, in person training program staff on member engagement, purchasing CRM software for better communication, and acquiring digital tools for enhanced security and content creation.

## Strengthening governance, resource generation, and digital skills for enhanced NGO impact

NFN, Nepal

NFN (NGO Federation of Nepal) will assess governance and management gaps, develop essential guidelines, and train 280 member NGOs in resource generation and digital skills. Key actions include digitising the members database, providing participatory training for the board and staff, hiring experts to establish policies, and enhancing digital capabilities through new IT equipment and software.

## 8 The Forus Leadership Development Program kicks off!

Forus has launched the 5th cycle of its Leadership Development Program with a dozen participants from 5 continents! This program focuses on adaptive and inclusive leadership in an era of unprecedented challenges, equipping participants with the tools to build sustainable networks and drive transformative change within their communities. By promoting storytelling, peer-to-peer learning and cross-border collaboration, the program builds on the work from previous cycles The Forus Barefoot Guide and nurtures a new generation of leaders committed to advancing social justice and inclusion.

This cycle focuses on women's leadership, aligning with Forus' commitment to gender equity and the 2025 review of SDG 5 on Gender Equality. Through initiatives like #MarchWithUs, Forus amplifies stories of gender justice while supporting the advocacy skills, confidence, and synergies to lift women leaders and strengthen inclusive civil society governance.

## 9 Forus Fundraising Support to its members

In 2024, Forus launched a new webpage accessible to members only. ## 10 The ComsForUs Working Group

This specific working group for Forus members to share and develop their communications practices advanced digital activism and communications, focusing on AI ethics and storytelling strategies. Their work included launching a Communications Clinic, developing narrative checklists for Forus members, collaborating on joint campaigns, and promoting positive narratives about civil society. In 2025, they will expand their efforts on digital activism, deconolising language and innovative campaign strategies.

In 2024, Forus continued supporting its members to monitor and advocate for the implementation of the sustainable development goals. We led the way to revitalise the UNMute initiative with partners, to ask for an inclusive negotiation process for the Summit of the Future -- more than 440 organisations followed our call to action.

We also embarked on new consortium ventures to rally civil society voices around joint projects. As such, 2024 was a foundational year for the establishment of the EU System for an Enabling Environment for Civil Society (EU SEE), which is now starting to be rolled out with the implementation of an Early Warning and Monitoring Mechanism to document changes and shed light on critical trends in the enabling environment for civil society.

2024 was also marked by the launch of the Civil Society Alliances for Digital Empowerment (CADE) initiative also stands as a key example of Forus' advocacy and partnerships, enhancing CSO involvement in global digital policy and supporting more inclusive, participatory practices in digital governance.

## **SINCE THE ADOPTION OF THE SDG FRAMEWORK, FORUS HAS REMAINED DEEPLY COMMITTED TO THE 2030 AGENDA, ADVOCATING FOR STRONGER ACTIONS AND CONCRETE COMMITMENTS FROM DECISION-MAKERS.**

### **ACCORDING TO THE FORUS 2024 MEMBERSHIP SURVEY, 91% OF MEMBERS STATED THAT FORUS IS A TRUSTED SOURCE OF INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE ON AGENDA 2030 IMPLEMENTATION AND MONITORING.**

In 2024, Forus members focused on driving SDG implementation at the national level while also pushing for meaningful strategies at regional and global levels, emphasizing the need for clear benchmarks and tangible progress over mere rhetoric. Forus has supported several of its members in engaging with the Voluntary National Reviews while consistently calling for comprehensive approaches that ensure the protection of human rights, adequate financing, and the active participation of civil society organisations in all decision-making processes.

Through initiatives such as #UNmute, Forus highlighted the growing disconnect between the UN and civil society, urging for a renewed commitment to inclusive and participatory governance.

With 39 UN Member States presenting their VNRs in 2025, including 13 countries in which Forus has members, we are reflecting and sharing as a network on past VNR experiences, particularly in light of national CSO platforms presenting for the third or fourth time, to help Forus members engage in the 2025 VNR process. In parallel, Forus is developing a member-led global report on localisation and partnerships under SDG 17, which will be launched during the High-Level Political Forum (HLPF) in July 2025.

## 11 The Forus network at the UN High-Level Political Forum – main takeaways.

Forus made a significant impact at the 2024 High-Level Political Forum (HLPF) through various events and initiatives aimed at advancing SDG16 and promoting inclusive governance attended by over 200 participants including Forus members, CSO partners and policy-makers.

- **Online Launch of the "Rebuilding Trust for Inclusive Governance" Report:** Forus launched a new report, developed with members from all continents, highlighting challenges and best practices in promoting inclusive governance and advancing SDG16, crucial for peaceful and just societies.
- **Event: From the Margins to the Mainstream:** Forus, TAP Network, UNDP, and the governments of Uganda and Nepal will hosted a side-event addressing the global erosion of trust in institutions, which undermines progress towards SDG 16.
- **Supporting Forus members with Voluntary National Reviews (VNRs):** As part of our Support pillar focused on capacity-strengthening with impact, from Uganda to Mexico, Forus supported several of its members with the monitoring and implementation of the Agenda 2030. From producing shadow reports, to participative awareness campaigns on the SDGs, discover some of the projects carried out by [Forus members here](#).
- **Social Media & online Advocacy Workshop:** Aimed at equipping Forus members and partners with strategies for effective digital advocacy, this workshop focused on using social media and emerging technologies for engagement and mobilisation, with special attention to HLPF 2024.



## 12 The Forus network at the Summit of the Future

With a delegation of over 10 national civil society platforms, Forus played an important role at the Summit of the Future (September 22-23, 2024) at the UN Headquarters, advocating for stronger global governance and accountability, particularly in the areas of financing for sustainable development and the protection of civic space. Key initiatives included:

- **Virtual Side Event:** Redefining Official Development Assistance (ODA): This event, co-organised by Forus and its members, focused on enhancing the quality of ODA to ensure it meets the real needs of recipient countries and communities, particularly in the Global South.
- **UNMute Manual Side Event:** Forus co-hosted an in-person event highlighting strategies for inclusive global governance. In 2020, [UNMute](#) launched as a collaborative effort between member states and civil society to highlight and expand the civic space - currently under pressure - at the UN with concrete, practical and operational guidance tools for Member States who strive to deliver networked, inclusive and effective outcomes and approaches to participation at the United Nations.
- **Advancing Global Governance Reform Event:** Forus participated in a session exploring synergies between the Summit of the Future and the G20, focusing on reforms for the UN and International Financial Institutions to build trust and resilience through multistakeholder partnerships.
- **Global People's Assembly 2024:** In partnership with Global Call to Action against Poverty (GCAP), Forus supported this hybrid event from September 22-24, which brought together civil society networks, activists and grassroots organisations to discuss critical topics like civic participation, gender equality, and financing for sustainable development.



## 13 AN ENABLING ENVIRONMENT FOR CIVIL SOCIETY - FORUS APPROACH AND CONTRIBUTIONS

In 2024, Forus members and partners joined forces in defending civil society spaces and supporting Forus members facing increasing legislative threats worldwide.

- **Advocacy and communications against legislative threats and solidarity calls:** Forus members have been actively fighting new legislative proposals that threaten the autonomy and security of CSOs. From Zambia to Paraguay, Forus continued to call for international solidarity and collective action to protect civil society's autonomy and space, providing support to members across the network. - **EU SEE Initiative:** As part of the EU System for an Enabling Environment for Civil Society (EU SEE), Forus is working with global and national partners in 86 countries to monitor and document changes in the enabling environment for civil society. This initiative provides unique data and actionable insights for CSOs, governments, and stakeholders to address emerging challenges and seize opportunities. Following its launch, the EU SEE Hub now showcase country-specific snapshots, offering critical information to guide evidence-based advocacy and inform strategies for protecting and enhancing the enabling environment for civil society. ## 14 IN 2024, FORUS MOBILISED ITS NETWORK IN ADVANCING CIVIL SOCIETY'S ENGAGEMENT IN INTERNET GOVERNANCE FORUMS, BOTH IN FRONT OF AND BEHIND THE SCENES.

Despite facing barriers such as limited access to policy discussions, underrepresentation—especially from the Global South and for grassroots organisations — and challenges in navigating internet governance systems, Forus continued to advocate for more inclusive digital governance.

- **CADE Mapping and Baseline Survey on CSO and internet governance engagement:** Led by Forus, the CADE Mapping and Baseline Survey provides a critical overview of CSOs engagement in internet governance across various regions. By identifying key actors, gaps, and opportunities, the survey sheds light on how CSOs are influencing digital policy spaces and where stronger participation is needed. This foundational data helps inform more strategic, inclusive approaches to ensure civil society voices are heard in shaping the future of the internet. Learn more [here](#).



- **2024 Internet Governance Forum (IGF):** At the 2024 IGF, Forus hosted a session as part of the EU-funded Civil Society Alliances for Digital Empowerment (CADE) project. This session presented preliminary research findings on the capacity of CSOs to influence emerging technology policies, shared strategies to enhance their impact, and provided actionable recommendations for integrating CSOs into internet governance processes. - **Global Digital Compact:** At the Summit of the Future, Forus actively participated in the Association for Progressive Communications (APC) Global Digital Compact Civil Society Strategic Discussion Space, sharing strategies for the implementation and monitoring of digital rights and governance.
- **Ongoing #Let'sTalkDigital campaign:** In 2024 we explored digital rights, digital governance issues, and the opportunities for civil society to engage in shaping the future of the internet with Forus members and partners from across the globe.
- **“Tech Talks”, digital bulletin and knowledge sharing:** Forus supported its network on emerging tech issues—like AI, cybersecurity, and surveillance—through workshops, trainings, and resources. It also launched a Digital Bulletin to share insights and best practices on digital governance, boosting members' capacity to engage and advocate in the digital space.



## 15 AMID A COMPLEX WEB OF GLOBAL CRISES, INCLUDING CLIMATE CHANGE, BIODIVERSITY LOSS, RESTRICTIONS ON AN ENABLING ENVIRONMENT FOR CSOS, AND GROWING DEBT BURDENS, FORUS REMAINED A VOCAL ADVOCATE FOR A PARADIGM SHIFT IN DEVELOPMENT FINANCING.

### AS WE PREPARED FOR THE FINANCE IN COMMON (FICS) SUMMIT IN 2025, FORUS CONTINUED TO CALL FOR A PEOPLE- AND PLANET-CENTRIC DEVELOPMENT APPROACH.

Forus' engagement around the Finance in Common initiative continued through close partnerships with four member organisations: [ABONG](#) (Brazil), [ADA](#) (Asia), [CCONG](#) (Colombia) and [NNNGO](#) (Nigeria). These organisations worked at national and regional levels to demand that civil society be meaningfully included in Public Development Bank (PDB) policies, operations, and projects.

As part of our broader advocacy efforts, Forus continued to advocate for the respect of human rights and the meaningful inclusion of civil society in shaping global financial systems, with the outcomes of our advocacy work contributing to key processes such as around the C20 summit, FiCS and the road to FfD4. Some of our collective work includes:

- **Finance in Common process:** In 2024, Forus, as the lead of the Informal CSO Mechanism on FiCS planned for engagement in the 2025 Finance in Common Summit in Cape Town, South Africa. Forus also launched a [study](#) and [toolkit](#) on CSO engagement with Public Development Banks as well as various multimedia products – including in-depth interview with civil society representatives, short documentaries and more.
- **Forus statement on ODA budgets:** As a global civil society network, Forus called for a system that holds countries mutually accountable and ensures that development finance genuinely reaches those who need it the most. In particular, fifty years after DAC countries pledged to dedicate 0.7% of their Gross National Income (GNI) to Official Development Assistance (ODA), persistent underfunding and weak accountability mechanisms raise serious concerns about the global community's commitment to meeting the needs of the world's most vulnerable populations, particularly in fragile and crisis-ridden contexts. - **Social movements and civil society partners at the Civil20 (C20) Summit:** On the occasion of the G20 Summit, members from across the world, including Japan, China, and Brazil, joined social movements and civil society partners at the Civil20 (C20) Summit. In 2024, under the leadership of Forus' member in Brazil, the Brazilian Association of NGOs (Abong), the C20 raised critical issues related to global governance reform, tackling urgent challenges like climate change, gender inequality, economic injustice, and the erosion of civic space. Forus and its partners amplified calls for systemic change, urging G20 leaders to prioritise gender-inclusive policies, anti-racist economies, the fight against hunger, and robust action on climate change. As we look ahead to the G20 Summit in South Africa in 2025, Forus remains committed to working alongside members and partners to advance systemic change. - **Global Gateway - strategies to strengthen civil society engagement with EU Delegations:** Forus continues to engage through the [Global Gateway Civil Society and Local Authorities Dialogue Platform](#). Forus used its role in the Dialogue Platform to represent members' priorities in EU discussions, advocating for inclusive and transparent Global Gateway projects. Forus prepared a 2025 training—alongside members like CONCORD Europe—to help civil society engage effectively with EU Delegations at the national level.



## FORUS WORKING GROUPS

Forus' working groups have developed initiatives across various global issues identified by the network's members. From the SDGs, to communications, digital rights and more, together, these working groups have built strong foundations for collective action, knowledge-sharing, advocacy, communications and capacity-strengthening. Find a few highlights from the Forus working groups below.

**The Agenda 2030 Working Group** focused on accelerating SDG progress by addressing civil society's role in Voluntary National Reviews (VNRs). The group contributed to the launch of key reports and to engaging in global advocacy at the UN High-Level Political Forum (HLPF).

**The Financing for Sustainable Development (FfSD) Working Group** prioritised reforming the global financial system, conducting mapping exercises on various actors and issues, such as ODA, climate finance, and Public Development Banks. A major achievement was the launch of the Engaging PDBs Research Study and toolkit. In 2025, the group will continue advocating at major international events like the Finance in Common Summit (FiCS) and the Fourth International Conference on Financing for Sustainable Development (FFD4).



The **Enabling Environment Working Group** focused on threats to the operating space for civil society, including authoritarianism, restrictive laws, and digital repression. They contributed to initiatives such as the Forus Solidarity Compendium and the UNMute initiative, advocating for stronger CSO participation in global governance. In 2025, the group will lead campaigns to amplify CSOs' critical role in sustainable development, and in partnership with the EU SEE initiative, it will continue to shed light and strategise on threats and opportunities to an enabling environment for civil society.

New in 2024, **the Local Power Working Group** focused on "Shifting the Power," addressing inequities in funding and colonial legacies while exploring participatory grant-making. The group launched a Shift the Power Resources Library and is now working on bi-monthly sessions to promote financial autonomy and inclusive advocacy.

**The Digital Governance Working Group**, launched in late 2024, provides a platform to tackle issues like digital inequality, data protection, and civil society's role in shaping tech policies. The group's collaborative efforts aim to address the challenges posed by emerging technologies like AI and cyber security for CSOs.

Forus governance structure is designed to have strong leadership by members, and for decision-making to be emerging according to joint needs and priorities that we can tackle as a network.

The Forus Council is made up of 15 members, with a regional distribution of seats. Its role is to ensure the implementation of decisions and of the strategic and political orientation agreed upon in the General Assembly, as well as the proper functioning of the executive team. Some of the Council's functions are delegated to the Executive Committee (ExCom), composed of a Chair, 3 Vice-Chairs and a Treasurer. In 2024, the Council was partly renewed during the Forus General Assembly, with five new members joining: CODE-NGO (Philippines), Cooperation Canada, Red Encuentro (Argentina), UNNGOF (Uganda), and VB Plataforma (Lithuania). 



# INCOME IN 2024

In 2024, Forus significantly expanded all its advocacy, networking and capacity strengthening activities thanks to the continued support of the French Development Agency (€603,680), the framework partnership with the European Commission (€630,228) and other public and private donors. Thematic projects (on digital empowerment and enabling environment monitoring) implemented in consortium were launched in 2024 with the support of the European Commission (€415,371). Membership fees for Forus members amounted to more than €30,000 in 2024. Finally, within the framework of the projects implemented by the members with the financial support of Forus, co-financing (amounting to approximately €12,000) has been identified by the beneficiary platforms.

## 2024 Revenues




# EXPENSES IN 2024

In 2024, staff costs (€743,236) represented the largest item of expenditure: this total includes team members recruited as internal consultants. The second largest item of expenditure was financial support for Forus members (€491,605). The use of external experts (€89,009) and interpreters / translators (€61,351) was limited. Forus held its General Assembly in 2024, which resulted in a significant level of meeting costs (€262,073). Overheads were incurred prudently (€62,276).

## RESULT

The positive result (+ €42,699) for the 2024 financial year is linked to unallocated income (such as membership fees) and savings in secretariat overheads.
